What is Padlet?

Padlet is a software, available at - https://padlet.com/dashboard, people use to make and share content with others. Somewhere between a doc and a website builder, Padlet empowers everyone to make the content they want, whether it's a quick bulletin board, a blog, or a portfolio.

Padlet is:

- Easy and Intuitive you won't find a simpler way to publish original content on the internet.
- Collaborative Invite others to work with you on shared projects, assignments, and activities.
- **Flexible** Add any file type you wish, organize however you want, and make it as public or as private as your heart desires.
- **Beautiful** Hit the design sweet spot with just enough options that you can add your personal touch, but won't be overwhelmed by customization menus.
- **Private and secure** Make your padlets viewable only to a select group of people.
- It's free for schools

What is a padlet?

A padlet, with a lower-case "p" is the page you post content on. A padlet is like a little notepad to post thoughts, images, and files.

What can I post into a padlet?

Files of different types, such as

- video (ex. recorded, YouTube, Vimeo)
- audio (ex. recorded, Spotify, Soundcloud)




- documents (ex. Microsoft Word, Google Docs)



3rd step – Make a padlet



Explore the various possibilities the website offers, according to your needs.

4th step – choose the option you like most. (My sweet canvas)

Title – give a title to your work

Description – give a short description

Choose wall paper – among the various wall papers available choose the one you like most / more suitable to your work


When you click next your padlet will be saved.

Share your work with others

Add the email address from whom you would like to contribute to your padlet.

Add contributors – if you want to add others manually, you can enter their emails or usernames and adjust individual permissions.

You can upload different files – picture, film, document, whatever - or you can write in your post.

Add contributions

Add contributors, or go on it alone.

The **Share** menu (top right) may look complex at first. There are lots of options so you can make content as public or as private as you want.

Privacy:

• Choose from 4 standard options: Private, Password Protected, **Secret [default]**, and Public. Choose whether people can read, **write [default]**, moderate, or administer your padlet.

Add contributors:

• If you want to add others manually, you can enter their emails or usernames and adjust individual permissions.

Advanced:

- Turn off remakes if you don't want others to copy your padlet to use as a template.
- Turn on moderation so that you can approve posts before they appear.

Share / export/embed

Share options can be found in the share menu in the upper right corner. The Share menu contains both privacy settings and sharing channels. To view sharing channels, tap the Share/Export/Embed tab.

Share the link

You can always share your padlet by simply **copy/pasting the link in your address bar**. If your privacy is set to Secret and Can Write (the default settings), anyone with the link will be able to view and post to your padlet.

Send your work out to the world

When you're ready to share your padlets outside of your inner circle, go to the Share menu and select **Share/Export/Embed.**

Export your padlet as a file, embed it on your website, send the QR code, or share on social media.

Embed in the eTwinning website; send by email; share in Facebook.

Go to the TwinSpace of our project

Create a page

Copy the embed code from the padlet

Choose the option Font on your page at the TwinSpace of the project

Paste the embed code

It's done!!!!

Now you can add new posts in our TwinSpace.
